

# MARRIAGE AND ADOPTION POLL February 2013

**CLIENT**: Family First New Zealand

**POLL DATES**: Evenings of Thu 14, Sun 17, Thu 21, Sun 24 Feb 2013

**SAMPLE SIZE**: 1,000 respondents agreed to participate.

**SAMPLE SELECTION**: A random selection of 10,000 nationwide phone numbers.

**WEIGHTING**: The results are weighted to reflect the overall adult population

in terms of gender, age, area and deprivation decile.

**SAMPLE ERROR**: Based on this sample of 1,000 respondents, the maximum

sampling error (for a result of 50%) is +/- 3.2%, at the 95%

confidence level.



### SAME SEX MARRIAGE

In 2004, Parliament legislated to allow same sex couples to register a civil union, amending over 150 pieces of legislation to give legal rights and recognition to same-sex couples. Do you think Parliament should change the definition of marriage to allow same-sex couples to marry, or do you think civil unions are sufficient for same sex couples?
